## **Cerro Coso Students Help Habitat for Humanity**

Office procedures for the IWV affiliate of Habitat for Humanity, as well as Habitat's local public information program, have recently been enhanced with the assistance of computer and business classes at Cerro Coso Community College.

Using the local Habitat administrative offices as a laboratory, students in Professor Jeannette Bournival's Office Personnel Seminar classes have helped organize the filing system, developed administrative procedures, created correspondence, and proofread documents. Two Office Personnel Seminar OPS students are presently volunteering time in the office outside of their completed class requirements.

Participants in Ms. Bournival's PowerPoint Class have developed four audio visual presentations, that are now available to members of the Habitat speakers-bureau. According to Bud Shull, Executive Director of Habitat-IWV, "These entertaining and informative programs can play a big role in getting out our message about providing affordable housing to qualifying partner families." In addition, Mr. Shull credits the OPS class's contributions with significant

improvements in the way Habitat can handle their multiple administrative chores.

In recognition of the two classes efforts, Mr. Shull and Habitat Board of Director's President Ken Kelley recently visited the college to present miniature hammer pins to the students.

### **The Felici Piano Trio Performs at Cerro Coso**

The Fire Mountain Foundation presented the Felici Piano Trio and guest artist, Ron Selka on clarinet, Monday, January 27, 2003.

The Felici Piano Trio was founded in 1994 at Indiana University's renowned School of Music in Bloomington. Acclaimed as "A True Trio Con Brio", the critics praise Felici's "first class chamber music making" and "...tremendous joy in music". The ensemble traveled to Mammoth Lakes through a Rural Residency grant from Chamber Music America, awarded to the Mono County Arts Council (MCAC). In 1999, Felici and the MCAC received a three-year Artist-in-Residence grant from the California Arts Council (CAC) for educational outreach programs for children, as well as a 2001 Exemplary grant. For eight consecutive summers, the ensemble concretized in Germany under the auspices of Rhineland-Palatinate's *Kultursommer*, and appeared on 3SAT and ZDF Television as well as recorded for German Southwest Radio (SWF). In November 2002, the Felici Trio embarked on its first tour to Chile. Felici's most recent CD of Tchaikowsky's *Trio in A Minor* is currently available.

Ron Selka is the Principal Clarinetist of the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra. Before joining the I.P.O., he was the Assistant Principal/Eb clarinetist of the orchestra of the New Israel Opera. He has performed in recitals and chamber music in Germany, Luxembourg, Spain, USA, and Israel.

As a soloist, Mr. Selka has appeared with the Jerusalem Symphony Orchestra, the Israel Symphony Orchestra, Rishon Lesion, and the IDF Chamber Orchestra. This coming December, he will perform as soloist with the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra under Maestro Mehta. Mr. Selka is a prizewinner in both Coleman and Fischhoff chamber music competitions (USA, 1994) and was a semi-finalist in the CIEM International Clarinet Competition in Geneva (1997). He participated in "Music by the Red Sea" festival, the Israel Festival, Pro Festival (Germany), and the Kol Israel chamber music days. Mr. Selka has made numerous recordings for the Israel Broadcasting Authorities.



### **Driver Ed Class Offered at Cerro Coso**

Cerro Coso is offering Driver Education as a community education course. Driver Education will present to the beginning driver a practical and realistic guide to the fundamentals of driving and the rules of the road. ### **New Local Certificate Program in Web Design for Education**

On January 15, 2003. The Media Arts Department at Cerro Coso Community College announced that they will be offering a local certificate program in Web Design for Education.

This certificate program has been created to equip Sierra Sands Unified School District faculty and staff to publish curriculum and instructional media on the internet. This program which includes existing courses that are part of the Cerro Coso's state-approved Web Design Associate Degree program consists of 4 courses: Digital Media Design, Digital Imaging, Accessibility and Usability, and Web Animation. Each of the classes will be offered over a semester in 3 five-week sections to accommodate the busy schedules of District employees.

The first course, Digital Media Design, is being offered in this current Spring 2003 semester. The first section is now open for enrollment. The class will be meeting on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:00 - 6:30 p.m., beginning January 28, 2003 at Burroughs High School, Room C14. In addition to learning foundational principles of page layout and design, students will learn in this first course to use Macromedia Dreamweaver MX, which has emerged as the leader in web development software.

Ms. Laurie St. Gean, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction of Sierra Sands Unified School District, expressed her enthusiasm about the program, "Sierra Sands is extremely excited about working with Cerro Coso College in offering staff development opportunities for our staff. Technology is one of the district's top priorities, and we are exploring as many options as possible for achieving the goals set forth in the district's technology plan. Staff members have expressed their excitement about the certificate program in Web Design for Education, and we hope this is just the beginning in this partnership with Cerro Coso Community College."

### **Cerro Coso Offers San Juan River Expedition**



Cerro Coso is offering a river rafting trip from Bluff, Utah, to Lake Powell April 20-25, 2003. The cost is \$1020 per student and includes dinner Sunday night in Bluff, the motel room for Sunday and Friday nights, all meals on the river, guides, and river equipment for a five-day trip on the San Juan River. Students need to provide their own camping gear and clothes. A list will be provided. A deposit of \$250 is needed upon registration and the remaining amount

due by March 14, 2003.

The San Juan River Expedition is an “easy” river trip, with a few Class I and II rapids to splash you once in awhile. The class will visit many archeology sites – Anasazi ruins and petroglyph panels, which can be reached only by river; many side canyons and grottoes to explore; and 2 plus days of traversing the famous “Goosenecks of the San Juan”. This is “red rock country” at its finest. There are 86 river miles from Bluff to Lake Powell.

## **NEW CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS REPORT Eastern Sierra College Center**

### **Bishop**

The following are the accomplishments at Eastern Sierra College Center- Bishop Campus through January 15, 2003:



The plumbing contractor continues installing finishes in the restrooms and the pumps and

pipng associated with the main mechanical rooms and mechanical yard. The mechanical contractor is installing registers and drops in the ceilings. The electrical contractor is installing lighting as well as plug and switch finish. The EIFS work is continuing with about 65% of the finished coat in place. The metal roofing contractor is continuing to install the metal roof panels. The parapet cap flashing is continuing as the finish is applied to the exterior walls. Interior tack-board and ceiling grid is mostly complete. Painting throughout the building is underway and most of the exterior glazing is complete. The casework contractor has installed the majority of the cabinets and some of the tops are being placed.

### **Mammoth Lakes**

The following are the accomplishments at Eastern Sierra College Center- Mammoth Lakes Campus through January 15, 2003:



Cold-formed framing is continuing with the exception of the ceiling in the Co-Lab room. Electrical and HVAC top out are continuing throughout the building. Interior insulation and drywall installation is continuing.

## IWV Learning Resource Center Ridgecrest

The following are the accomplishments at IWV Campus through January 15, 2003:



Roof decking is nearly complete. Metal studs installation on exterior continues. Second floor pan deck and staircase concrete has been poured. HVAC ductwork has started on the first floor lower section. Plumbing and electrical rough in is proceeding as areas allow.
