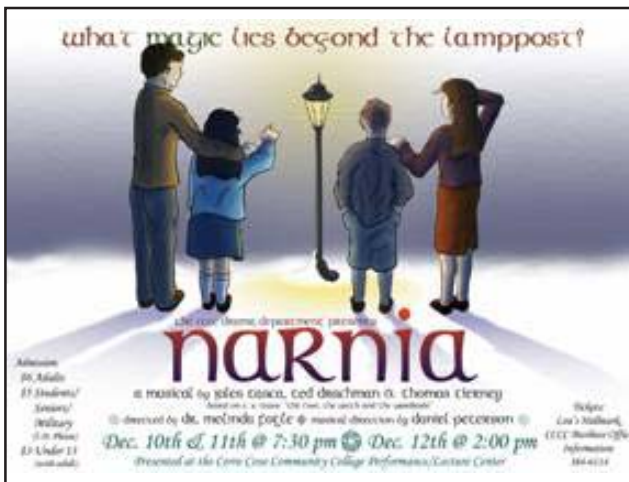

On Friday, November 19, 2004, several students volunteered to assist in shopping for groceries, filling baskets of food with turkeys or hams and all the fixings, and helping to deliver these baskets.

Then, in the coming weeks, not associated with any particular organization, student volunteers will get involved in shopping for toys for children, wrapping & delivering the toys, and also spending time with senior citizens over the holiday, if only to help cheer them up and put a smile on their faces. Student volunteers will be given contact information to donate time to local organizations that need volunteers.

Mr. Garcia first started this project in 1995 to assist families in Modesto, California. Last year, his students in San Antonio helped feed 22 families over Thanksgiving and another 13 over Christmas (also provided toys for their children).

Mr. Garcia asked for volunteers from his classes after a paper was assigned on Homelessness and Poverty as part of their Analysis Portfolios. Students were asked to volunteer that no extra credit would be given. Mr. Garcia's would like to instill in his students a sense of giving back to the community of which they are a part.
