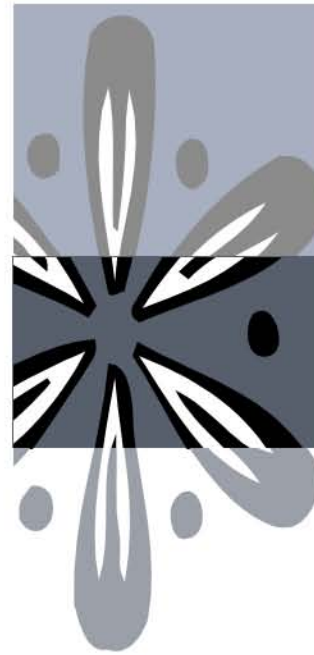


Intensive Spanish Summer Program Accommodations
