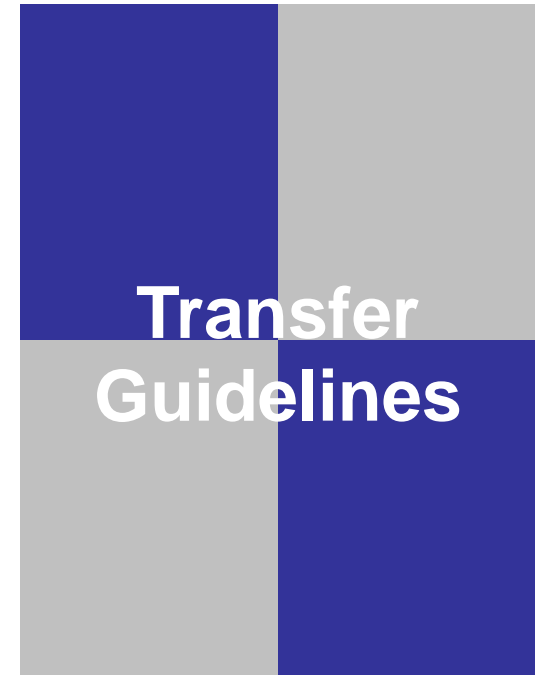

How to transfer to the University of California

First: Start completing immediately your Math & English requirements. The UC places a high priority on students that complete transferable Math & English courses early in their academic careers. Take the College Placement Exam immediately to see what Math & English course to start with.

Second: The UC gives high priority to students that complete major coursework early in their academic career. Please visit www.assist.org to learn more about major preparation work. Meet with a counselor or take a career planning course to help focus you on a particular major.

Third: Complete 60 UC transferable semester units with a minimum 2.4 GPA (2.8 for Non-residents) for minimum eligibility. The GPA for admission can be significantly higher due to the applicant pool. Along with Math & English, and your major coursework, you are required to complete four courses in at least two of the following areas:

- Physical/Biological Sciences
- Art/Humanities
- Social/Behavioral Sciences

Fourth: Complete your General Education (GE) requirements, usually by completing the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC).

Fifth: Apply on time! **ALL** UC's accept in Fall, which requires you to apply a full year in advance. Some UC's accept Winter and Spring applicants, but you should check with a counselor to see which UC's are accepting. For Fall 2008 transfer, students must apply online at www.ucop.edu/pathways.

First: Start completing "The Golden Four" as soon as you can. Complete one course in each of the four areas below:

- 1) ENGL C101
- 2) ENGL C102; INST/PHIL C205
- 3) SPCH C101
- 4) MATH C121, C130 C131, C141, C142, C151, C152, C251, C255, C257

Second: Complete 60 transferable semester units with a minimum 2.0 GPA. The GPA for admission can be significantly higher because of the major, campus, and/or applicant pool.

Third: Complete coursework in the major along with your General Education (GE) requirements. Please visit www.assist.org to learn more about major prep work. To satisfy GE, you have two choices: IGETC or CSU GE. Talk to a counselor to determine which is the best option.

Fourth: Apply on time! All Cal States begin accepting application beginning October 1-November 30 for the following Fall. Most CSU's accept applications through March, and some accept even later. But, the sooner you apply, the better your chances are for admission. For Fall 2008, all students must apply online at www.csumentor.edu.

How to transfer to Private/Independent or Out-of-State Colleges

Transferring to private/independent or out-of-state colleges is different than applying to a UC or a CSU. The minimum requirements for transfer vary from college to college, and from major to major. Essentially transferring to private/independent or out-of-state colleges requires the following:

- 1) Complete a minimum amount of transferable units (usually 30)
- 2) Complete the appropriate English and Math requirements.
- 3) Complete General Education courses.
- 4) Complete courses for the major
- 5) Earn and maintain a competitive GPA
- 6) Apply on time

Financial Aid Information

Financial aid programs provide support for students to help meet the costs of obtaining a college education. There are four basic types of financial aid programs that are available:

- Grants— federal or state gift assistance with no obligation for work or repayment.
- Scholarships— gift assistance with no obligation for work or repayment.
- Loans— providing funds now, but with a future repayment obligation.
- Work-Study— Part-time work while attending the institution.
